1. Call to Order and Introductions

Chairperson Derek Krevat called the meeting to order at 10:02 A.M. Charles Kilmer then read the meeting accessibility statement, and the Title VI Notice of Protection Statement. Charles Kilmer conducted the roll and announced there was a quorum present.

2. Public Comments

Chairperson Derek Krevat asked if there were any public comments. There were no public comments.

3. Minutes of the November 15, 2022 Meeting

Chairperson Krevat asked the MPO Members for comments or changes regarding the minutes of the November 15, 2022 meeting.

Meredith Anderson made a motion and Mary Waldron seconded to endorse the minutes of the

November 15, 2022 meeting.

There being no changes, the Old Colony MPO then voted unanimously via roll call to endorse the minutes of the November 15, 2022 Old Colony MPO Meeting.

4. Brockton Area Transit (BAT) Report

Michael Lambert provided the following updates:

- BAT and the other RTAs are offering free rides from Thanksgiving to New Years. This has resulted in a 4% ridership increase
- BAT continues to improve the new expanded Market Basket stop at Westgate Mall. There are new shelters, planters, and signage
- BAT has launched their first endeavor with micro-transit which is serving the town of Rockland. This is a soft launch, with a full launch coming later
- BAT received additional funding through MassDOT with the Community Transit Grant
 Program to help support the micro-transit program going forward
- OCPC staff will be joining BAT on Thursday to ride the BAT buses

5. MassDOT District 5 Updates on Projects Under Design or Construction

Richard Bilski provided an update on some projects under design or construction. They are as follows:

STOUGHTON - CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS ON ROUTE 138

Plans, Specifications, and Estimates (PS&E) due in March

DUXBURY - BRIDGE REPLACEMENT, D-14-010 (48H & 48J), ROUTE 3 (PILGRIM HIGHWAY) NB/SB OVER FRANKLIN STREET

- Letters of Intent have gone out and they are due this December
- Request for Qualification is to be mailed out shortly

FFY 2024

BROCKTON - INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AT CENTRE STREET (ROUTE 123) AND PLYMOUTH STREET

- Follow up Comment Resolution Meeting held
- At 25% design and expecting 75% design in July

BROCKTON - INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AND RELATED WORK AT CENTRE STREET (ROUTE

123), CARY STREET AND LYMAN STREET

75% design due in January

FFY 2025

BROCKTON - INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AT LYMAN STREET/ GROVE STREET/ SUMMER STREET & REPLACEMENT OF GROVE STREET BRIDGE, B-25-005, OVER SALISBURY PLAIN RIVER

- At 25% design with revised 25% design due in January
- Received the Bridge Type Study

EASTON - CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS ON ROUTE 138 INCLUDING INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AT ROUTE 138 (WASHINGTON STREET) AND ELM STREET

100% design due in April

FFY 2026

AVON - INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS AT ROUTE 28, SPRING STREET AND HARRISON BOULEVARD

At Pre-25% design and expecting 25% design in February

FFY 2027

BROCKTON - INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS @ CRESCENT STREET (ROUTE 27)/QUINCY STREET/MASSASOIT BOULEVARD

- At 25% Design
- Awaiting additional input from City of Brockton

6. FFY 2023-2027 Transportation Improvements Program (TIP) Amendments and/ or Adjustments

Adjustment 1 - Review and Potential Approval

Bill McNulty presented Adjustment 1, which is as follows:

FFY 2023

- 1. BROCKTON AREA TRANSIT (BAT) BAT TERMINAL, INTERMODAL (TRANSIT)
 - ADJUSTMENT: INCREASE COST FROM \$100,000 TO \$127,000 (Increase State (RTACAP) from \$20,000 to \$47,000). The resulting costs are: \$80,000 Federal, and \$47,000 State (RTACAP)

Chairperson Krevat asked if there is a motion to endorse Adjustment 1. A motion was made by Meredith Anderson and seconded by Dan Salvucci.

Dan Salvucci asked if the increase in cost is due to increase in material cost. Michal Lambert stated that the increase is to accelerate the start time of the project. The grant award had a later start date, this allowed BAT to get the project started sooner before the cold weather sets in.

The Old Colony MPO then voted unanimously via roll call to endorse Adjustment 1.

7. Draft 2022 Old Colony Title VI Reports

- 2022 Old Colony Title VI Annual Report Review and Potential Approval

Shawn Bailey presented on the 2022 Old Colony Title VI Reports. As sub-recipients of federal financial assistance through MassDOT, OCPC and the Old Colony MPO are responsible for all civil rights compliance.

- Ensure there are no discriminatory practices in carrying out services
- Triennial and annual Title VI Reports
- Catalogue policies, complaint procedures & forms, investigations, complaints, and lawsuits
- Document demographic analysis, LEP/LAP Plan, and Transportation investments

Current Status:

- LEP/LAP Plan completed
- Annual and Triennial Title VI Reports completed and provided in advance of the MPO meeting.

Chairperson Krevat asked for a motion to endorse the 2022 Old Colony Title VI Annual Report. A motion was made by Mary Waldron and seconded by Meredith Anderson.

Dan Salvucci and Mary Waldron commented that Shawn Bailey presented outstanding reports.

The Old Colony MPO then voted unanimously via roll call to endorse the 2022 Old Colony Title VI Annual Report.

Chairperson Krevat asked for a motion to endorse the 2022 Old Colony Title VI Triennial Report. A motion was made by Dan Salvucci and seconded by Meredith Anderson.

The Old Colony MPO then voted unanimously via roll call to endorse the 2022 Old Colony Title VI Triennial Report.

8. Development of the 2050 Old Colony Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) - Update and Status Report

Bill McNulty provided an update and status report on the development of the 2050 Old Colony LRTP.

Old Colony Planning Council is currently developing the Old Colony Metropolitan Panning Organization's 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan. Staff are currently finalizing a public survey, while collaborating with planning partners and stakeholders, and Old Colony Planning Council is embarking on its public outreach process for this Plan development.

Socioeconomic Projections and Travel Demand Model Update

Staff have been actively participating in a Socioeconomic Data Projections Committee, which is

comprised of MPOs and the Massachusetts Department of Transportation. The University of Massachusetts Donahue Institute has been contracted to work with the Committee in developing population and economic projections through 2050. These projections are important as they help guide planning and investment in the future, but they also are a critical component of the travel demand model, which is also being updated for the LRTP.

Pavement Survey and Analysis

Staff continue to survey pavement conditions along the Federal-Aid Eligible surface highway network in the region and is performing analysis to determine conditions ratings which in turn guide the planning needs for maintaining the network in a state of good repair and reaching performance management targets.

Goals of the Old Colony 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan

The Goals of the Old Colony 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan are stated as such:

- Safety: A safe transportation system that minimizes risk of serious injury to motorized and vulnerable users of the system and helps the Region and Commonwealth move towards its Vision Zero goals
 - **Transparency and Equity**: An open and inclusive planning process that ensures representation and access to all persons
- **Economic Vitality**: A transportation network that fosters and supports a robust and diverse economy in the Old Colony Region
- **Security**: A transportation system that maintains security for physical infrastructure and the users of the system.
- Accessibility: A transportation system that ensures access and mobility for all motorized and vulnerable system users
- A Clean Environment: A transportation system that is not only protected but enhanced through energy conservation and smart, green practices
- Resiliency: A transportation system that is sustainable and resilient
- State of Good Repair: A planning process that prioritizes maintenance and keeping physical infrastructure in a state of good repair
- Efficiency: A transportation system that minimizes financial and environmental costs associated with congestion and delay

Planning Scenarios

During development of the Beyond Mobility: the statewide Massachusetts 2050 Transportation Plan, it was identified how these recent trends have already had a substantial impact on how people live, work, and travel in the Commonwealth, and how these trends could continue to affect the state through 2050.

- Climate Change
- The Future of Work
- Population Tends
- Housing and Economy
- Prosperity
- Technology

The Old Colony Long Range Transportation Plan will present how these factors have affected the region, and how acceleration, maintenance of the status quo, or a reversal of trends through 2050 could affect the region.
